

Temples of Nainital

1.Naina Devi Temple



Naina Devi Temple comes from one of the Fifty-one Skti peethas where the other body parts of Mata Sati fell. The Temple is a sacred and religious place of great devotion in Nainital. The word Naina Means Eyes at the site the Eyes of Goddesses Sati's Felt there. Goddess in this holy temple is represented by her two eyes. Devotees come here from all over the world to take the blessing of Maa Naina Devi. ABD Holidays provide the tour package for this devotional trip. That is based on Nainital. The temple is located at the top of the Naina hillock near the Naini Lake, the Devotional belief attracts thousands of devotees at the temple, Prasad and Pooja Items are available in local shops.

2. Hanuman Garhi




This Temple is dedicated to Lord Hanuman this is the temple noted on the Nainital – Haldwani route. Devotees believed that temple was established by the Famous and well-known Neem Karoli Baba, who was a famous saint during the 1950s. On the other side, there is Sitla Mata Temple. Both the Temple site gives you an adorable view of sunrise and sunset. ABD HOLIDAYS PRIVATE LIMITED customizes the trip including this temple. The inside of the temple contains an idol of Lord Hanuman opening his chest and showing images of Lord Rama and Goddess Sita in his heart.

3. Pashan Devi Temple



Temple is situated near Naini lake. This temple is noticed for Akhand Jyoti the Goddesses Pasahn known as the one Avtar from the Nine avatars of Devi Durga the temple is well-knowing for the Stone structure and the Pasahn Devi is also worshipped in the form of stone. A large number of devotees visit the Pasahn Devi temple as it is located in close vicinity to the Naini lake. And offer water flows in the Naina Lake, on the goddess.

4. Muktesh war Temple



ABD Holidays covers this Historical, Devotional temple during the trip, this temple is 350 years old temple situated at Mukteshwar town Nainital. That is dedicated to Lord Shiva. The temple was built by the Pandavas during their 12-year exile period. The town owes its name To the Mukteshwar temple. devotees believed that the Mukteshwar temple is one among lord shiva's famous 18 Temples. visitors come to take the blessing of Lord Shiva over the year. This site is the best place for meditation.

5. Kainchi Dham



Kainchi is a term used for two sharp hairpins. Temple dedicated to Lord Hanuman and established by well-known saint Neem Karoli Baba in 1960 This temple owns his Ashram it's just 17 km from Nainital in 70s Steve Jobs visited the Kainchi Dham The founder of Facebook Marks Zuckerberg also visited the Kainchi Dham. In the mid of June, the fair is organized every year which attracts devotees in large numbers.

6. Golu Devta Temple



Temple situated at Gorkhal the revered God of the Kumauni devotee. In this temple, people write wishes on Paper after the completion of wishes bells are offered to give thanks to the Lord. The Golu Devta knows for justice, devotees believe that their wishes will be fulfilled in the Temple. Thousands of bells tied in the temple show the faith of devotees. The peacefulness of the place attracts the people to the Temple.

Temples of Ranikhet

7. Haidkhan Temple



The temple has big statues of Lord Shiva and Lord Hanuman. Temple offers a scenic view of Himalaya peaks like Nanda Devi, Panchachulli, and Trishul Parvat. it's just 4km from Ranikhet. the temple is established by Haidkhan Maharaj who is known as the Avtar of Lord Shiva. The devotees from abroad visit the temple for their marriage at Indian Traditional. ABD Holidays covers this destination over their trip to Ranikhet.

8. Jhulla Devi temple



Jhulla Devi temple is an ancient 8th-century temple which is located at a distance of 7 km from Ranikhet near Chaubatia. famous for the different bell structures as per the Mythology of the sculpture of hula Devi found by the Herdsman. who was guided by the deity's own in his dream devotees believe that whoever offered bell and ties to the temple completes his / her wishes over time?

9. Binsar Mahadev Temple



Temple was built in the 9th Century, which gives special religious importance to the Temple. It is noticed for the architecture used to build, also known as Bind Eshwar Temple the surrounding of the temple is covered by Oak, pine, and deodar trees. Temple is located 19 km away from Ranikhet. Devotees believed that the Temple was built in a day. Temple worshipped Lord Ganesh and Mata Gauri and Mahisasuramardini. The temple also has an ashram dedicated to Binsar Mahadev.

10. Banri Devi temple



Banri Devi Temple has situated 26 km from Almora on the Almora-Lamgarha Road. out of the 26 km, we have to trek almost 10 km, and hence reaching this temple is extremely difficult. Temple dedicated to Lord Vishnu; the shape of the temple is octagonal, and four-armed Vishnu sleeps at Seshnag. The main deity of the Temple is Lord Vishnu.

11. Someshwar Temple




Someshwar Temple is a small temple located in the beautiful Someshwar Valley in the Almora district of Uttarakhand. Temple is Dedicated to Lord Shiva, Someshwar valley is surrounded by lush greenery and a peaceful environment. The valley is situated on the banks of two rivers, Kosi and main the devotes have the importance of Lord Shiva at Someshwar Temple.

12. Girja Devi Temple (Corbett)



The Garjia Devi Temple is one of the oldest goddess temples in India, found on the border of a grand village called Girja near Ramnagar in Uttarakhand. Garjia Devi Temple, also known as Girija Devi Temple in Ramnagar, is a sacred Shakti temple where Garjia Devi is the presiding deity.

13. Sitabani Temple



Sitabani Temple is the site of Goddess Sita, the wife of Lord Rama. Sitabani Temple has located 20 km from Ramnagar. The temple organizes a big fair every year on the day of Ramanavami. The temple of Sita Maa is beautiful and serene situated amidst dense trees. Travelers come here to have a darshan of Mata and take a bath.

14. Devidhura Temple



Devidhura is famous for Varahi Temple. It's a Culture Heritage of Bagwell and is Commonly Practiced on The Day of Raksha Bandhan. Famous hunter Jim Corbett's story 'Temple Tiger' is associated with the Devidhura temples. Devidhura is situated amid tall cedar and oak trees surrounded by beautiful cedar and vegetation. It is a wonderful place for trekking.

15. Rudeshwar Temple



Rameshwar Temple is one of the ancient temples of Uttarakhand. A Hindu pilgrimage dedicated to Shiva and Rudeshwar Mahadev Temple in Almora district of Uttarakhand, India. Rameshwar Mahadev Temple situated on the banks of the Ramganga River is only 10 km from Masi and Bhikiyasain. ABD Holidays Pvt. Ltd covers this destination in their trips.

16. Patal Bhubaneshwar



Patal Bhubaneshwar, which means the sub-terranean shrine of Lord Shiva is a cave temple located about 91 km. from Pithoragarh and 14 km north of Gangolihat. The way to the temple is through a tunnel that leads into a cave and through a narrow dark passage of water. It is mentioned in detail in the 103 chapter of Maskanda of "Skanda Purana". The first human to enter this cave was "Rituparna", the king of the Surya dynasty during the Treta Yuga. It is said that during his journey, he encountered many demons and "Seshnag" himself served as his guide.

17. Jageshwar Temple



Jageshwar temples are located on the side of the river Jata Ganga at a height of 1870 meters. The Main temple of Shiva is covered by 124 small ancient temples of different gods. According to Skandhas Purana and Linga Purana, the worship of lord Shiva was started from Jageshwar and the 8th Shiva Jyotirlinga originated here.

Jageshwar Dham is one of the biggest groups of temples located in a single complex in the world. It has more than 125 big and small temples within its complex. The temple complex is named after the presiding deity Jageshwar, which is dedicated to Lord Shiva. ABD Holidays covers this temple according to the demanded packages.

Other Temples Near Jageshwar

18. Vinayak Kshetra



This Temple is just 200 Meters from the Jageshwar. The Place is located between Jhankar Sai Temple, Vriddhi Jageshwar, and Koteswar temples.

19. Shri Vridh or Budh Jageshwar



Temple is contemporary to the Jageshwar temple and is located just 7 km from the Jageshwar group of temples. Budh Jageshwar is situated at a High altitude.

20. Jhankar shamdevs Temple



The temple situated to the south of Jageshwar has religious significance, which attracts pilgrims to the area. According to folklore, when Lord Shiva was meditating (penance), demons came to interrupt his austerities. At that time, Trinetra was born to Lord Jhankar "Sam", who sends his gang to kill the demons. Legend has it that Lord Sam would again visit the Kotiling Temple and Jageshwar Temple to save humanity in Kaliyuga.

21. Katarmal Sun Temple



This temple was established by the Katyuri Kings in the 19th Century the Temple is dedicated to Lord Sun and the around the temple has 44 small Temples known as Burh data or Virhaditya In the premises of the temples also have the Statues of Shiv - Parvati, Vishnu – Laxmi. this temple is the second most important sun Temple in the Country the first time being in Orissa Temple is just 25 km from Ranikhet

22. Gairar Golu Devata



Golu devta is the Mythological and historical God of Kumaon just near Binsar wildlife century. Golu devta is known as the Lord of Justice. On the premises of the Temple, devotees tied the bell after completing of their wishes and give thanks to their Lord.

Temples in Bageshwar

23. Bagnath Temple



Bagnath Temple is an ancient shrine dedicated to Shiva, situated in Bageshwar city at the confluence of the Sarayu and Gomati rivers. Bagnath Temple is festooned with bells of all sizes and features impressive carvings. The temple was constructed in 1450, by the then ruler of Kumaon, Laxmi Chand, and stands at the breathtaking point where the river Gomati and Sarayu converge.

24. Chandika Temple



Temple dedicated to Goddesses Chandika just half Kilometre away from Bageshwar. Located at the confluence of the Saryu and Gomti rivers. And famous for the lord Chandika.

25. Baijnath temple



It is a cluster of 18 Stone Temple, the temple is located at the bank of river Gomti, the idols of the temple are Lord Shiva, Ganesh, Parvati, Chandrika, Kuber, Surya, and Brahma. the Town owes the name Baijnath from the Baijnath Temple. The main temple is dedicated to Baijnath and Vaidyanathan (name of shiva) as per Indian Mythology Lord Shiva and Parvati married at the confluence of the Gomati River and garur Ganga, Temple is located 22 km From the Bageshwar.

26. Bhadrakali Temple




Bhadrakali Temple is an ancient temple, dedicated to Goddess Kali. The temple is located close to Kanda and at a distance of 25 km. From Bageshwar in the Kumaon Himalayas. It is known for its religious importance and attracts pilgrims to the area. The temple is situated amidst the picturesque beauty of nature, with a spectacular view of the Himalayas.

27. Nanda Devi Temple (Almora)




Not for opulence, but the unbroken beliefs and traditions associated with Nanda Devi make it one of the top temples of Kumaon. It is located in the Almora district of Uttarakhand and is dedicated to Nanda Devi, who is considered an incarnation of Goddess Durga. She was the patron goddess of the Chand dynasty and is believed to be the protector of the inhabitants of Kumaon and other parts of Uttarakhand.

28. Kot Bhramri Temple (kausani)



Temple is also known as Kote -ke-Mai and Bhramri Devi temple. This temple is located at a 5km distance from Kausani. Temple attracts the devotees on the occasion of Nand Ashtami or Nanda Raj jattfair in the month of August.

29. Kot – Ling Mahadev



Kot Ling Mahadev Temple is located in the Hindu pilgrimage town of Jageshwar in Almora district, Uttarakhand. It is one of the most important temples in Kumaon and is located at the confluence of the Ganges and the Jamuna Rivers. According to legends, the place was chosen by Lord Shiva himself for meditation.

30. Hat Kalika Temple (Pithoragarh)



The Hatlike temple at Gangolihat in Pithoragarh district in Uttarakhand is one of the Shaktipeeth and an important pilgrimage center. The temple is the abode of the goddess Mahakali, who is believed to have migrated from West Bengal to Gangolihat. It is extremely famous across India, especially among the Indian Armed Forces.

31. Kalipad Shakti Temple




Located in the foothills of Girichina in the Bageshwar district, the Kalipad temple is remarkably popular for its magical power that attracts devotees from across the country. The mesmerizing scenes of the Himalayas and the serene It is located close to the confluence of the Gomti and Saryu rivers.

32. Gwal devta Temple



It is a popular temple in the Kumaon region, dedicated to the Gwal Devta, the deity of immense influence and faith. He is considered the God of justice, who is the victim of cruelty and injustice while doing justice. According to legends, Rajkumar Ghoril, the prince of Champawat, committed suicide under a well-planned plot by his stepmother and was thrown into a river and locked in an iron cage.

33. Siarkot Temple



3 km uphill climb from Didihat, this magnificent temple is seen from here overlooking the Himalayan peaks. Apart from this, the view of the valley is also visible. The town of Didihat is also clearly visible from here. There is an influx of devotees all the time in Sialkot.

34. Kalamuni Temple



The Kalamunda temple dedicated to Goddess Kali is a sacred place on the way to the town of Munsiyari as a place of worship. This place is famous for the Kali temple dedicated to the Naga God. The Kalamunda temple has a divine aura, which kills all evil energy and negative vibes.

35. Baleshwar Mahadev



Baleshwar Temple is an ancient Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva. This temple is also known as Baleshwar. There are two other temples on the premises of Baleshwar Temple, one dedicated to "Ratneshwar" and the other to "Champavati Durga". There is a small and big Shiva lingam installed in this temple. Baleshwar Temple is famous for its amazing carvings. The site of the Temple was declared a National Heritage Monument and is protected by ASI (Archaeological Survey of India).

36. Dunagiri Temple



Dunagiri Temple is located in Almora district at the altitude of 8,000 Feet from the sea level temple also known as Dronagiri at this site a Guru Dronacharya of Pandavas complete his penance Mountain owns the name as Dronagiri at this Mountain temple is located. This Temple of Mother Dunagiri is famous as the second Vaishno Shaktipeeth in the Kumaon of Uttarakhand after Vaishno Devi.
